Sad Death of Miss Elva Boothe.

One of Our Most Estimable Young Ladies Gone to Rest.

Tuesday morning at 8:30, the residents of this city and community were painfully shocked by learning of the sad life happy. news that the spirit of Miss Elva Boothe, one of our city's most bright and lovable young ladies, had taken its flight to the life beyond,

Miss Boothe was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H. L. Boothe who reside in the northern part of town. She had been an employee of Riter Bros, Drug Co. for the past year and nine months, but owing to ill health gave up the position a few months ago and has been confined to her bed ever since.

From a severe cold her case developed into pneumonia and later a puss formation congested her lungs, which finally resulted in causing her untimely death.
