## County Commissioners.

All members of the Board of County Commissioners were present at the regular meeting of the Board held Monday, August 15th.

A communication was received from Wm. Cottam Jr., Road Com'r at Snowville, stating that the \$5.00 taken from his bill at last meeting for cement was incorrect as he had the cement on hand. Clerk was instructed to write to him to use the cement at once on the bridge, and file claim for same.

A communication was received from H. A. Lafount, Mgr. of the Pacific Land & Water Co., asking the Board to put road between Kelton and Park Valley in good repair, as his company

intends to run and excursion to their land about Sept. 15. De-

A request was received from the Manufacturing Ass'n asking the Board to use some space in the Vermont Building at Salt Lake City, for display of products of Box Elder County. Joseph Marsh asked the Board to change road running through Sec. 22-10-6. Referred to Board for investigation.

Com'r Richards reported phone service of Road Com'r due over the Farmers' Line. Clerk instructed to write John Sommers relative to contract with 'phone Company, which stipulates that County officers have free service.

County Attorney Nels Jensen submitted an opinion on the

claims of Drs. E. I. Rich and J. D. Harding for expert testimony in the case of State vs. Blackenbury, which has been filed with the Clerk. Opinion held that the law does not provide for a fee of more than \$1.50 per day for witnesses.

C. Simonsen, in behalf of Executive Committee for Peach Day, asked the board to use some special stationery advertising that event. Granted.

Road Com'r Pierce reported road between Bear River City and Corinne in need of repairs; also road at Waukegan. Instructed to make said repairs.

The returns of the election of the Boniti Drainage District were canvassed, showing 7 voters for organizations and none against. G. L. Carlton, John P. Holmgren and Lawrence Hansen were declared elected Trustees.

A number of claims were allowed and the Board adjourned.
