## UTAH STATE NEWS

As soon as supplies arrive a contract station of the Bingham postoffice will be established at Copperfield.

The Globe Grain and Milling company has begun pouring concrete in the construction of its 3000-barrel flour mill at West Ogden.

Old folks of the Alpine stake of the L. D. S. church were the guests of honor at an outing given at Geneva, Wednesday, June 23.

That the farmers of Weber county will have abundant crops is the view of those who have completed the early survey of the district.

Steve Manlich, who, with Nick Oblizalo, is under sentence to be shot August 3 for the murder of Marco Lams, will appeal his case to the supreme court.

Part of the land included in the Price reclamation project has been thrown open for entry by rescinding a previous order providing for its withdrawal.

Veterans of Foreign Wars, post No. 409, have named the post in honor of Lieut. Clarence E. Allen, a Salt Lake, who was killed in action near Chateau Thierry.

According to the tax assessment just announced, the valuation of Delta property is \$563,885, which is a substantial increase over that of one year ago.

A "hikers' club" exclusively for girls has been organized at Kayville. It is planned to take numerous short walks and a few long ones during the summer months.

Sixty days in jail at hard labor or \$500 fine was the sentence meted out to five of the seven men found guilty in the city court at Ogden on the charge of gambling.

Utah county has appointed four boards of deputy assessors to accomplish the reclassification of all the farm and other lands in the county, including Vernal city.

Stepping from between two sprinkler wagons, which were parked near a curb, into the path of an approaching automobile, Eugene Morris, aged 3, was instantly killed at Salt Lake.

Louis Dobbs, of Bingham, who was seriously injured by the explosion of a giant powder cap in her kitchen range, is reported out of danger. It was necessary to remove one eye.

Equipment valued at hundreds of thousands of dollars is expected for the Utah state road commission from the army surplus as a result of negotiations entered into by the state road engineer.

The body of Levi Hunt, aged resident of Richfield, was found in the Sevier river by a party of searchers. Mr. Hunt wandered away from his home while suffering from mental aberration.

Frank Donovan, 21 years of age, of San Francisco, claiming to be a former service man, was arrested at Salt

Lake, charged with robbing a cafe, being captured by a private citizen who saw the robbery.

According to announcements made by the various committees which are working on a program for Independence day, Eureka is going to have one of the best and most elaborate celebrations in recent years.

Harry Johnson, alleged by the police to be the "King of Utah's Bootleggers," was found guilty of assault by a jury at Farmington. Johnson assaulted a woman at a roadhouse, the woman being badly beaten.

The census bureau has announced the population of Park City, as 3393, a loss of 46 in the past ten years, or 1.3 per cent decline. This decline, however, is less than Park City experienced in the previous decade.

Two young folks of Ogden narrowly escaped death when the automobile in which they were riding plunged over an embankment in Ogden canyon, and turning completely over, landed right side up in the bottom of a creek.

Construction of a wayside inn in American Fork Canyon by the Mutual Improvement Association of American Fork and Pleasant Grove was begun last week. The building will be completed before July 1. It is anticipated.

Becoming dizzy while standing on the bank of the river at Ogden, Gladys

Balsdell fell into the water and would have been drowned but for the heroic action of Alonzo Clark, who rescued her in an unconscious condition.

What appears to be a case of murder is presented to the authorities of Weber county for solution through the finding of the body of E. B. Howard, colored, 64 years of age, in the intake of the Davis and Weber canal in Weber canyon.

Thus far this year 36,571 licenses for motor vehicles have been taken out, compared with a total last year of 35,230, while the fees received up to May 30 this year amounted to \$281,801.24, compared with a total for 1919 of \$201,325.

The farm bureau of Cache county has just distributed a card of registered calves and bred heifers to various boy farmers and adults in the county. There were five head of purebred heifers, fourteen head of calves and one bull.

Thirty-six cavalry horses arrived in Brigham City last week from Fort Harrison, Neb., for D troop of the state national guard. The animals are all seasoned "war horses," fat and sleek, and make up the finest bunch of riding horses that ever came into the community.
