Said water will be stored from Jan. 1, to Dec. 31, incl., of each year in a reservoir embraced in Secs. 4, 5, 6, and 7, T. 6 N., and Secs. 32 and 33, T. 7 N., R. 3 E., Salt Lake Base and Meridian, which at full stage will inundate 400 acres of land. A concrete or masonry dam will be constructed across the South Fork at a point 2250 ft. south from the Northwest corner of said Sec. 7. The water will be released into and allowed to flow down its natural channel and discharge into the Ogden River, from where it will be diverted at various points by means of canals and used from April 15 to Oct. 15 of each year as a supplemental supply to irrigate 50,000 acres of land embraced in Secs. 1 and 2, T. 6 N., R. 1 E.; Secs. 5 to 9 incl., T. 6 N., R. 2 E.; Secs. 30, 31 and 32, T. 7 N., R. 1 E.; Secs. 31, 22, 25, 26, 27, 34, 35, 36, T. 7 N., R. 2 E.; all of Tps. 5, 6 and 7 N., R. 1 W.; all of Tps. 6 and 7 N., R. 2 W.; and all of Tps. 6 and 7 N., R. 3 W. PARIS, Dec. 22—Relatives of soldiers who fell at the battle front are being victimized by cab drivers, hotel men, dealers in coffins and grave diggers, according to L'Informateur. The newspaper says "this odious exploitation of grief is such that it cannot be passed over in silence."

It is charged that the worst cases of this occur in the Champagne and Somme regions, where unhappy pilgrims are from sixty to sixty-five francs for a six-mile drive. It is said the carriage drivers, in agreement with the inn keepers, invariably manage to miss the last train out of these regions so that the mournful of the cheapest grade, it is said, are sold from 300 to 400 francs.

Generator Blows Out

SALT LAKE, Dec. 22—A serious decrease in the power available for the operation of street cars was caused by a blowout in a large motor generator in the Utah Light & Traction company's substation at the rear of the company's building on West Temple street at 9:15 o'clock yesterday morning.

A lively blaze within the generator resulted from the blowout and necessitated a call to the fire department. A few gallons of chemical extinguished the fire. The blowout was caused by a short circuit in the armature of the generator.

Although the company has on hand all the necessary equipment to repair the damage, it will require three days and three nights of continuous work to put the generator back into operation, according to Manager H. F. Dicke of the traction company. In the meantime the company has taken measures to conserve power as much as possible and still meet the extra requirements of the Christmas shopping season.
