**OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLICITY.**

Three or four of Utah's athletes who have won championship honors in the United States and abroad are desirous of representing Ogden at the Olympic games next summer. These athletes are such experts in their line that they stand fine chances of carrying away honors in the divisions in which they want to appear. It will cost money to send the Utahns to Europe to wear Ogden's colors. The question is: Will the favorable advertising that Ogden will receive throughout the world from the announcement that one of its representatives has won a world event be worth the cost of sending the athletes to the games?

**FIGHTING SMOKE WITH EXPLOSIVES.**

Widespread interest has been aroused by Salt Lake's efforts to rid itself of the smoke nuisance. Recently the airplane was used in making investigations. This use of the plane provoked considerable discussion and the Philadelphia Ledger published an article about the event. The Ledger says: Salt Lake City has long suffered from a plague of smoke. Relief has been sought in vain.

In its not distant neighborhood, scattered about, are a number of huge plants for smelting metal ores. For a long time a theory has been entertained to the effect that sulphur dioxide gas from these plants spreads an invisible cloud high in the air and

holds down the city's smoke, preventing it from getting away. The United States Bureau of Mines was asked recently to test this theory and the means it adopted for the purpose was to send an airplane up above the smoke with vacuum bottles in which to collect samples of air far aloft.

Specially constructed vacuum bottles were sent from the bureau's Pittsburgh laboratory. To take the samples in the atmosphere the bottles were opened and immediately closed after swallowing their fill of air. Afterward the air in the bottles was analyzed and it was found to contain hardly any sulphur dioxide. Thus the ingenious theory above quoted was, so to speak, knocked into a cocked hat.

Dr. Lyon, supervisor of mining stations for the Bureau of Mines, is of the opinion that dirigible balloons, and possibly airplanes, might be used to great advantage for transporting the ores of precious metals from the inaccessible places in which they are commonly obtained. Thereby would be saved a great deal of money which otherwise must be spent for the making of roads.

It is thought that the same means might be utilized for the swift carrying of rescue apparatus to such mines in case of reported disaster or serious accident.

**AIR MAIL AT HAND.**

The senate postoffice committee has written into the postoffice appropriation bill a provision calling for the setting aside of \$1,100,000 for a transcontinental airplane mail route from New York to San Francisco. It seems almost certain that the bill will be passed when it is reported for action. This means that within a year government planes will be flying over Utah carrying mail to and from the Atlantic and Pacific oceans.

In connection with this airplane mail route a series of landing fields must be established. In Utah there is going to be a mail landing field either in Ogden or in Salt Lake. It is unlikely that there will be airplane mail stops in both cities. Much prestige will attach to being on the air mail route and Ogden might just as well have that prestige for the logical landing place for the transcontinental airplane mail route is here. Here's where we must go to work to bring about the result desired.

The books, among them many technical volumes, recently were shipped from New York by the American Library Association to Miss Mary E. Downey of Salt Lake City. As library secretary and organizer of the Utah department of public instruction, Miss Downey will have charge of circulating the books throughout the state. They are expected to relieve temporarily the need for wider public library service, which, since the war, has been acute in Utah as in every other state.

During the war the association served at the call of the government, caring for women and girls affected by war time conditions. The war is over but the aftermath leaves emergencies still to be met and the association in its 1920 program plans to meet these emergencies and care for the regular work of the association.
