slowly, rounding out his work and improving with each season, has reached the top of the list now in the American league while the youthful and brilliant Hollander of the Cubs tops the National leaguers.

That Hollander ranks ahead of the great Bancroft, who has been the ranking shortstop of the circuit for years, is due not so much to the fact that Hollander is improving and Bancroft is a bit past the top of his career, as it is to the fact that one is with a strong team which promises to be a contender, the other with an almost hopeless tailender. Further, Bancroft must bid against the wonderful pitching staff of the Cubs, while Hollander fattens up on the weaker offerings of the Phil twirlers in twenty-two games.

Chapman, the Cleveland veteran, is practically tied with Peckinpaugh for the honors of the American league. Last season Chapman suffered much from bad feet and legs caused during his service in the army, and his work was considerably impaired. It was late in the season before he really steadied to the task and showed the most brilliant form of his career.

It seems rather peculiar to see Donie Bush listed below two men in his own circuit, but Bush's supremacy in the past has been due largely to his great gift in securing bases on balls and he has fallen off steadily in this respect, so that he loses points in attacking power, and already has sloughed off some in his fielding. But Bush is not come yet, not by a whole lot, as is shown by the fact that the dope still rates him ahead of Everett Scott who has slipped back considerably, probably due to the break of his leg last year.

Scott may be expected to improve in his work in ratio to the improvement of his team's chances in a pennant race. He is a great player, and a winning player, and is prone to call into careless habits when the team is losing, a bad habit for one with years of baseball behind him.

Rabbit Maranville, who with a winning team perhaps would rank up at the top, did not show well last season in some details of the game. His weakness in attack drops him into third place in his league, just one point ahead of the veteran Fletcher. In the case of Fletcher I have been forced to use a combination, so that the new York figures are not for Fletcher alone but for his understudy, McGraw has collected a promising array of young talent and it seems certain that Fletcher will not be able to get the entire season at top speed and that Maranville will sub for him in a large number of games.

The champion White Sox make rather a bad showing in the dope in shortstop for a championship club. Nor is that the worst. Before this doping is over I expect to have to amend Chicago's shortstop figures so that they will express the real strength of the team. Until Gleason makes his final announcement as to his lineup, the present figures must stand.

The world's champion Reds rank pretty far down among the shortstops of the National, and at that the figures indicate that they have more position strength at short than they did last spring.

Beyond doubt Kopf played beyond his speed last season. He gains a number of points because of the fact that he is an extremely dangerous batter in a pinch. Moran evidently does not believe that he is as great a player as the figures indicated last year, for he has secured a capable and perhaps a coming man in Crane to sub on the job.

This fellow Crane has been tipped as a great player for four years and never has come through with the proof. Watch him under Moran. He seems to know something.

I am watching with great care the spring showing of Terry, of the Pirates. That bird is better than the dope indicated or I am way off. The closer one studies his figures, the more promising Pittsburgh's chances look.

Griffith is claiming to have a world beater coming along in Ellerbe, but the figures fail to prove his claims.

At any rate the shortstops are fairly well matched all down the line, and the tailenders have very fair men and show promise of developing new material.

Federal Grand Jury to Probe Sugar Prices
SAN FRANCISCO, March 26.—An announcement that he hoped to present evidence to the federal grand jury next week, possibly on Tuesday, in relation to recent advances in the price of sugar by refineries which serve the whole price cost from this city, with a view to determining if the Lever food control act has been violated, was made here today by Ben Geis, acting United States district attorney.

SHAMELESS SITUATION
PRESENT BORAH SAYS

Idaho Senator Says War Profiteers Have Combined to Control U. S. Parties

WASHINGTON, March 26.—Charging that "war profiteers" had combined to control the Republican and Democratic national conventions, Senator Borah, Republican, Idaho, told the senate today that the pre-convention expenditures of some presidential candidates presented a "shameless situation," promising a "saturnalia of corruption" unless congress called a halt.

Senator Borah's charges were made in presenting his bill for limitation of pre-convention expenditures.

Reading a published story that "testimonials" endorsing Major General Wood were being purchased in Indiana at the rate of \$2.50 apiece, Senator Borah said he had been advised that "plenty of affidavits to the same effect were on file in a neighboring state."

"General Wood's managers state that the managers for Governor Lowden are spending more money than they are. That is their defense. I am inclined to think that is true. There are some evidences of it."

"These gentlemen will frankly tell us where the money is coming from. I would be willing to accept their explanation. But when they remain silent there is only one inference to be drawn and that is that the charges are true."

Senator Thomas, Colorado, and Ashurst, Arizona, Democrats, asked Senators who were spending large sums of money and the speaker said he would do so at the proper time.

"If I knew any Democrat who was spending money excessively," said Senator Ashurst, "I should feel it my duty to see that he did not get some delegates he might otherwise get. And if I thought any Democrat was trying to get a third term I would not hesitate to tell the people that that was wrong."

"If the senator does not know that a Democrat is seeking a third term," rejoined Senator Borah, "then he is blessed with an innocence of which I would not suspect him. I think the president is entitled to a third term, for who else would lead the fight for the treaty?"

"Doesn't the senator mean a third nomination," asked Senator Moses, Republican, New Hampshire, who is manager of General Wood's Washington bureau.

"Well, if the senator from New Hampshire keeps up his practices and he is nominated, it will be a third term," Senator Borah replied.

Senator Borah quoted a newspaper report that the Democratic national committee was raising a ten million dollar campaign fund and added that there were evidences of a like situation in the Republican organization.

"But Chairman Cummings of the Democratic national committee has denied the story, interjected Senator Harrell, Democrat, Mississippi.

Senator Chamberlain, Democrat, Oregon, interrupted Senator Borah's reading of a list of names of alleged contributors in General Wood's campaign fund to ask if some of them were not giving money for political activities in both parties.

"They usually do," Senator Borah said. "Edward I. Doheny, head of great oil interests in Mexico, is named here as a contributor to General Wood's campaign fund."

I. W. W. Tampering
With Jury Venires

SEATTLE, Wash., March 26.—The charges that Industrial Workers of the World are tampering with jury venires are being investigated by Prosecuting Attorney Fred C. Brown, it was announced today.

Brown said that several members of the March panel of the superior court have complained that I. W. W. agitators have been working in resident districts gathering information about the prospective jurors.

Some of the investigators, it was charged, wore stars and represented themselves as being sent by the prosecuting attorney to "find out what sort of a jury he would have to deal with." Several criminal syndicalism cases are to be heard in the superior court, with the next few weeks.

WASHINGTON, March 26.—First evidences of friction at the headquarters of Rear Admiral William B. Fletcher at Brest came with the arrival here of Captain Thomas H. Magruder, commanding the third fleet of American craft sent to that port, Admiral Fletcher testified today before the navy board of inquiry investigating his removal from the Brest command by Rear Admiral Sims after the sinking of the transport Antilles in October, 1917.
