barrels per day, suddenly dropped last night to the rate of 16,000 barrels per day, and water began to come up with the oil in quantities variously estimated at from 2 to 3 per cent.

This is not only the first big sign of stopping its marvelous gait that this well has shown, but it is also the first time that any water has come up with the oil.

The Lakeview gusher is 1,600 feet below the mean level of the Santa Barbara channel and 60 miles distant. Despite this distance, engineers have discovered that the flow of the gusher is directly affected by the tides. The forerent of oil increases with high tide and decreases with low tide, but just what the ratio of increase and decrease is has not been determined, although the difference is manifest.

According to geologists, the wash of the sca has had much to do with the deposit of petroleum in the so called oil sands, it being found in zones as if cost up by the tides. As proof of this contention shellfish, starfish, mammoth oyster shells and sharks' teeth have been found in the oil sands of many fields in this state.

The Lakeview gusher was tapped on March 15 last, since which time it has flowed from 40,000 to 60,000 bairels a day. The well came in at a depth of 2,206 feet, but has long since developed into an immense oil crater, the extent of which none can tell.

"Receipts of hay for the week just past were comparatively heavy, 3,630 tons arriving, whereas during the week previous but 2,566 tons were received. The increased shipments have had a material effect on not only the local market, but also on country buying. The local situation continues unsatisfactory, it being extremely difficult to move hay at all, with, of course, the exception of the choicer qualities, which usually take care of themselves. There is some movement on the part of consumers to lay in a supply of hay for fall and winter use, but this demand is very light, compared to what it was a few years ago. "There has been purchased in the country but very little hay for storage, with the exception of the Livermore section, in which district operators, have paid very high prices, comparatively speaking, for many round lots of hay, but this movement now has ceased to a great extent. There is a growing desire on the part of the fatimers throughout the country to sell their hay, and, although it is not late in the season at all, yet the prudent farmer is beginning to think of getting his hay under cover, for already in some districts rain has been threatening."
