Judgment for damages was granted to the Kosmos steamship line yesterday against the owners of the French bark Germaine, in a decision by Judge R. S. Bean of the United States district court. The Kosmos steamer Hermonthis was injured by the Germaine at the Oakland long wharf on March 5, 1909, when the latter broke loose from its moorings during a southwester and rammed the other vessel. The officers of the Germaine sought to hold the Southern Pacific responsible, alleging the piles of the pier were rotten. Judge Bean, however, holds the bark's officers wholly responsible in not taking advantage of the weather bureau's warning to mariners. This exonerates the Southern Pacific. The amount of damages wil be determined by the court commissioner. The suit was for \$5,200.
