SYNOPSIS OF WEATHER CONDITIONS

The weather is fair over the entire country west of the Rocky mountains except for thunder storms in the mountains of Arizona.

Showers are reported in the Mississippi valley and in the north Atlantic states. No heavy rain has fallen.

The temperature is rising at many eastern points and falling in the Missouri valley. Afternoon temperatures exceeding 100 degrees are reported in Iowa and exceeding 98 degrees in Missouri and Kentucky.

On the Pacific slope there have been no changes of importance. It is becoming gradually warmer in the great valley of California, and conditions are favorable for fruit.

There is more fog than usual along the coast.

FORECAST

Forecast for the 30 hours ending at midnight, Wednesday, August 15, 1911:

San Francisco and vicinity—Fair Thursday; light fog in the morning; light southwest wind changing to moderate west.

San Joaquin—Fair Thursday; moderately warm; light west wind.
California south of Tehachapi—Fair Thursday; moderate temperature; light north wind, changing to south.
