**LADIES' BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION.**—An official notice elsewhere inserted, calls for a meeting of the above Association on Saturday, the 27th inst., at 9 o'clock A. M. The Association, aided by the City Council, has, we are happy to say, inaugurated their praiseworthy undertaking of a "House of Industry" for the indigent poor of our city, where efforts will be made to provide with work and means for a livelihood, all those legitimately entitled to the watchful care and protection of the Association.

The City Council has resolved to appropriate fifty dollars monthly, commencing the first of August proximo, and also to grant the use of a building—either the Academy Hall or the school-house contiguous to it, as may be selected—in order to further the benevolent purposes of the Association. Temporarily, the ladies have secured a building up town which is in use and will continue to be used as a "House of Industry," until other arrangements shall have been consummated.

**DEATH OF JUDGE JONES.**—Robert Byron Jones, better known as Judge Jones, who was arrested recently at Natchitoches, brought to this city, and confined in the military prison on a charge of having been implicated in the murder of Cyrus W. Stauffer, died of cholera, on Saturday evening, at No. 191 Baronne street, where he had but a few hours before been removed from the prison. His brother, Dr. Jones, died, it will be remembered, of the same disease a few days previously. Both were but little over thirty years of age, and both leave families.
