### MUST A RAILROAD HELP RIVAL ROAD?

This Question Is Raised in a Suit Filed in United States Court.

C., R. & FT. W. IS PLAINTIFF.

SUBSIDY WAS VOTED TO A NEW RAILROAD AND THE OLD ONE HAS DECLINED TO PAY ITS PORTION OF THE LEVY.

"The Cincinnati, Richmond & Ft. Wayne Railroad company vs. Lawrence Hayes, treasurer, and Wilburn L. Smith, auditor of Jay county, and James Ruple, Levin H. Trehearne and Milton Millett, board of commissioners of Jay county," is the title of a suit filed Wednesday in the United States court to develop some interesting legal phases.

The taxpayers of Wayne township, in September, 1903, voted a donation of \$54,500 to the new railroad company, the amount to be raised by a special levy upon the property of the taxpayers.

The levy, as originally voted upon, was to be in two payments, one in 1904 and the other in 1905. In Wayne township, where the Cincinnati, Richmond & Ft. Wayne is affected, the levy on their holdings is \$2,867.99. They have failed to pay the levy, and the authorities have threatened to take steps to assume charge of sufficient property of the company to bring the required sum.

The plaintiff contends that it is not compelled to assist in the construction of a rival company's right of way, and asks to have its property protected from seizure as well as to have a final settlement of the case. Legal authorities differ on the subject at hand.

### POSTAL CARDS MADE UP IN 10,500 LOTS

Accommodates Persons Who Want Special Printing.

BENEFIT TO WHOLESALERS.

Postmaster Spekenhiser received a communication from Washington this week notifying him that hereafter postal cards would be made up in 10,500 lots for the accommodation of those persons who wish to turn them over to the printer for special printing. The postal cards will be in large sheets and can be cut after having been printed. The arrangement is looked upon as very satisfactory. Particularly will it benefit large factories and wholesale houses of Richmond which make announcements by this means.
