Roosevelt on Success

Theodore Roosevelt was a many sided man, a typical American, with a philosophy of life that appealed strongly to his fellow countrymen. The following paragraphs from a speech made by him at Cambridge University, England, May 26, 1910, just after he returned from his hunting trip in Africa, contain opinions and suggestions that are worth heeding:

There are two kinds of success. One is the very rare kind that comes to the man who has the power to do what no one else has the power to do. That is genius. I am not discussing what form that genius takes; whether it is the genius of a man who can write a poem that no one else can write ("The Ode on a Grecian Urn," for example, or "Helen, Thy Beauty is to Me") or of a man who can do one hundred yards in nine and three-fifths seconds. Such a man does what no one else can do. Only a very limited amount of the successes of life comes to persons possessing genius. The average man who is successful—the average statesman, the average public servant, the average soldier, who wins what we call great success—is not a genius. He is a man who has merely the ordinary qualities that he shares with his fellows, but who has developed those ordinary qualities to a more than ordinary degree.

It is just so in public life. It is not genius, it is not extraordinary subtlety or acuteness of intellect, that is important. The things that are important are the rather commonplace, the rather humdrum, virtues that in their sum are designated as character. If you have in public life men of good ability, not geniuses, but men of good abilities, with character—and, gentlemen, you must include as one of the most important elements of character common sense—if you possess such men, the government will go on very well.

I believe that the man who is really happy in a great position—in what we call a career—is the man who would also be happy and regard his life as successful if he had never been thrown into that position. If a man lives a decent life and does his work fairly and squarely so that those dependent on him and attached to him are better for his having lived, then he is a success, and he deserves to feel that he has done his duty and he deserves to be treated by those who have had greater success as nevertheless having shown the fundamental qualities that entitle him to respect.

The Cash System

The war has had a peculiar effect on trade conditions in England. Although the debt of that country has increased by leaps and bounds, the debts of the English families have decreased. Business men of that country report that very little credit has been asked or given in the last four years to individual families.

Two reasons are assigned for the condition. In the first place, the war taught the housewives thrift, which they practiced so rigorously that they had enough money to pay cash for their foodstuffs and clothing. A second compelling cause was that the housewife wanted to stay on the good side of the tradesmen, for she realized that if she persistently refused to pay her bills the tradesmen, when shortages of food arose, would naturally favor the customers who paid cash. Reputations for slow pay brought an inevitable punishment that could not be evaded.

Conditions in America did not reach the critical stage experienced in England, but nevertheless many housewives, forced to watch their expenditures closely, began to shop with more intelligence and to take advantage more quickly of bargains available for cash payment. Having once learned the advantage of not having "household debts" hanging over them, many housewives concluded that the cash system was preferable to the credit system.

Business men hope that their customers will continue to deal with them on a strictly cash basis. The advantage is mutual and if it could be carried out on a scale involving every purchase in a retail store in the United States, both dealers and purchasers would save thousands of dollars annually.

In Honor of an American Satirist

THE proposed observance of the hundredth anniversary of the birth of James Russell Lowell by a representative group of English and American men of letters should meet the approval of all right minded and intelligent persons provided it is organized and conducted by men of high literary reputation.

That the assembling of a distinguished body of writers from both countries for the purpose of doing honor to the American poet and essayist will help along the cause of Anglo-American unity is more than likely certainly it will serve to draw attention not only to Mr. Lowell's works but also to those of his contemporaries, some of whom are in danger of being forgotten.

It was the good fortune of this man to live during the golden age of American letters, when Hawthorne, Emerson, Holmes, Curtis, Longfellow, Whitman and others were giving the lie to the complacent British sneer, "Who ever reads an American book?" He gained his renown at a time when book readers were less numerous than now and far more critical: when wit and biting political satire did not hopelessly damn a manuscript in the editorial eye; when "best sellers" were unknown and literary talent was not put to the degrading task of amusing chauffeurs waiting before doctors' offices and road houses.

Many writers will delight to do honor to Mr. Lowell's memory on the 19th day of February, but among them all it will be hard to find one who is his equal as poet or essayist and above all as a wit and satirist.
