On Friday evening the regular commencement exercises were held and another large audience was present. The chief feature of this program was the eloquent address of Dr. Roberts on "True Education," which was highly appreciated by the audience.

Excellent music was a feature of all the exercises of the week.

Memorial Services

On last Sunday morning the old soldiers of Lamar, both the blue and the gray, formed in line in front of Judge Deeter's office on Main street, and following the band marched to the M. E. Church for memorial services. The line has been much depleted by time and many familiar faces were missing, but the old spirit was there as strong as ever and they marched with a firm step that seems to have defied the ravages of time.

At the church a special program had been prepared and there was a union service of all the churches, a very large congregation being present. Dr. Roberts of Denver University delivered the sermon and all the exercises were appropriate to the day.

Normal Institute.

The teachers' institute for this normal district will be held this year in Lamar beginning the first week of June and lasting two weeks. Dr. Frank H. H. Roberts of the University of Denver will be the conductor and he will be assisted by Mrs. Ida Kruse McFarlane, Mrs. Elizabeth McMeichen of the Wyman school in Denver, and Prof. Chas. E. Griffin, of the La Junta high school.

There will be lectures by State Supt. Katherine Craig, Mrs. McFarlane, Dr. Roberts, Prof. F. E. Thompson, Mr. Fred Burkett and Mr. W. M. Wiley.

Special railroad rates have been secured from the Santa Fe from all points in Colorado, and a big attendance is expected. The program prepared is very interesting and the conductor, Dr. Roberts, and his assistant, Mrs. McFarlane, were the unanimous choice of the executive board on account of their successful work at the Rocky Ford institute.

SANITARY NOTICE.

Lamar, Colo., June 1, 1908.
You are hereby notified that all premises owned, or occupied by you, or over which you exercise control as owner, agent or otherwise, situated within the limits of the Town of Lamar, Colorado, must be put in good sanitary order, by thoroughly cleaning all closets, cesspools, privies, etc., also by removing from said premises, and from the alleys adjacent thereto, all manure, garbage, filth and refuse matter of every description, on or before June 15, 1908. All garbage should be kept secured from flies until dry, and then burned.

To avoid possible infection from water, all water used for drinking should be boiled.

The co-operation of all citizens with the health officers will aid in keeping the town free from contagious and infectious diseases.

A failure on your part to conform fully to this requirement, and within the time specified, will subject you to the full penalty prescribed by the ordinances of the said Town of Lamar.
