It behooves the people of this section of the state and especially the newspapers to stand shoulder to shoulder in an effort to advertise the peculiar resources and advantages of north central Minnesota.

Discretion.

The Pioneer is rebuked because it stated that the state auditor is compelled to use his discretion in settling timber trespass cases, and the following excerpt from the state laws is quoted:

"Provided that he shall not make any such settlement for an amount less than double the value of such timber as shown by such scale and appraisal." Chapter 163, Laws of 1895, Section 33. Who fixes the "value of such timber?" The state auditor has to fix it and the only way he can fix it is to estimate it from the scale and appraisal. That's the way it has been done, the way it is done now and the way it always will be done.

The charge against Mr. Dunn may be urged with equal force against Mr. Iverson and against all other gentlemen who have held the office of state auditor.
