Another Tragedy in Milwaukee's "Death Block."

Milwaukee, Oct. 28.—Seven firemen are dead and a score injured, while damage estimated at \$500,000 was wrought by the fire that destroyed the building occupied by the Goodyear Rubber company.

The dead and injured were buried under a wall which collapsed following an er exich after the fire had been burning for several hours.
