Loss of Life Heavy in Bolivia Fighting

LIMA, Peru, June 27.—(AP)—Bautista Saavedra, former vice president of Bolivia, in a telegram from Arequipa, Chile, today said there had been a heavy loss of life in fighting in streets of La Paz, Bolivian capital, Wednesday night. His message follows:

"The rebels are dominating the situation, and I can assert that the only government positions are the government palace and Comercio street.

"It is known that the number killed last night in La Paz is great, among them many socially prominent persons."

Previous telegrams from the former vice president and exile had said that the military college, aided by civilian and other military

elements revolted and defeated the loyal regiment.

Saavedra blames the president-resigned, Hernando Siles, and the German commander-in-chief of the Bolivian armies, General Kuntze, who has supported M. Siles, for the sanguinary disturbances. The revolutionary elements charge that M. Siles is attempting to have himself re-elected president in defiance of the constitution.

NEED NOT FEAR

LISBON.—The recent fad of cigarette lighters has cut the revenue Portugal has been receiving from the sale of matches considerably.

Consequently, in order to protect the match industry, the government has decided that person must own a license to operate cigarette lighter. This license costs \$1.50, which would buy enough matches to last one man nearly a year.
