

Proposed Increase of 100 Per Cent in the Tax on Cigarettes Will Fall Heavily Upon Tobacco Growers of the Carolinas and Virginia.

The prosperity of tobacco growers of North and South Carolina and Virginia will be seriously interfered with if the proposed 100 per cent increase in tax on cigarettes goes into force. Increased taxes must be added to the cost of the manufactured article. As that cost increases, the cost to the consumer also increases, and the amount consumed decreases, which smaller instead of showing a steady

the increased consumption of ciga- tax. rettes the price paid for the leaf has also increased

The present war affects, if it does not in fact prohibit, exportation. This leaves practically the entire crop in this country, and, if the price of cigarettes is raised to the consumer, the consumption of them will naturally decrease. As the price of leaf is governed b ythe law of supply and demand the price of leaf would naturally decrease. In any event, the reaction on the grower would be felt first in the Carolinas and Virginia. Hence, it is plain that the best protection a farmer could have would be a low tax on cigarettes.

Since the growers of tobacco suitable for cigarettes are so vitally affected it would be to their interest to immediately communicate with their Senators and Represe statives at Washington, urging that their interests be fully considered in making any change in the tax on cigarettes.
