To Change Charter

A. EFFORT WILL BE MADE TO FIX THE LAW SO WE CAN HAVE SIDEWALKS.

The Project to Establish Paving Districts is a Good One. Approved By Lawyers.

It has been some time since the city council have said anything about the proposition to pave San Antonio street with asphalt, but the question has not entirely died out by any means.

R. V. Bowden, the attorney who queried the property owners on the subject some time ago, says that there are only a few who object to it and he thinks it can be done. Mr. Bowden is now working on an amendment to the El Paso city charter, which he will have presented to the state legislature soon, providing a way to force street paving in any city. He has been at work on the matter for some time and says now that he is confident that the law will be made and made so that it will stand a supreme court decision.

In the case of the recent project to pave San Antonio street nine of every ten property owners agreed to pay their part of the expense of paving that street but the few who objected held the matter in check and made it impossible for the work to be done. By the action of a very few, San Antonio street, the leading thoroughfare of the city, remains in as bad condition as any side street in the city when all the taxpayers except probably four or five favored the work. It is to control these people that Mr. Bowden hopes to get the charter changed.

"My plan is to have the charter changed providing for the establishment of paving districts in every incorporated city," said Mr. Bowden, "and I think it will pass the legislature without trouble. The bill will ask that a two-thirds portion of property owners on certain streets or in a certain part of a city can vote street paving certificates bearing small interest and negotiable and the city be empowered to levy and collect extra taxes on property in that district to pay for the work. The city will collect the taxes at the same time other taxes are collected and pay off a part of the bonds every year. The expense of street paving if paid for in property taxes will amount to practically nothing and the indebtedness thus incurred would be lifted within a few years. I am sure every city in Texas will favor the bill for the same reason in street paving is met with in every town in the state. It is important that the streets should be properly paved and cared for and it cannot be done under the present laws, and especially the present charter of El Paso. Should this law go into effect next month for instance, every street in El Paso could be paved and paid for within ten years and no one would feel the cost."

Mr. Bowden has given this matter a great deal of thought and has studied the laws well. He has tried to get the property owners here to pay their part on the street paving proposition but a few people who are now getting good rents from their property objected.

"Getting around the homestead law will be the greatest trouble," continued Mr. Bowden, "but that can be done. It can be done under the head of forcing the people to improve thoroughfares about their homesteads and pay taxes for same as they do in the matter of schools now. It appears to me that if property owners can be forced to pay taxes on their homesteads for the support of schools they can be forced to pay taxes to keep the streets."

Every one who has talked to Mr. Bowden about the matter has endorsed his project and it will probably go before the state legislature at this term.
