Fourth－The said officers shall proceed at nice to count the vote，as soons as the polls are closed，and shall then certify the votes and seal same with the books，and deliver same on Monday，March 12th，or at latest on Tuesday，March，13，1883，to W，W． Ball，and the said W．W．Ball，Wm．P． Coons and Perry Jefferson，or a majority of them shall constitute an examining board and shall proceed to count the votes from all the precincts on said Monday or Tues－ day，in their discretion，and certify and deliver the entire vote and poll books to G．S．Wall，chairman．The said examin－ ing board shall give a certificate of elec－ tion to the person receiving the highest number of votes，and said person shall be the nominee of the Democratic party of Mason county for the office of Repre－ sentative in the next Legislature．In case of a tie，the examining board shall decide by lot．
