MOVING PICTURES IN COUNTY SCHOOLS

New Class and Cloak Rooms, Manual Training and Other Improvements

When the improvements contemplated by the Madison county school board are concluded, there will be a great change in evidence at the White Hall, Big Hill and Science Hill, the work of one of the school improvements being under way while plans and specifications are being drawn for another. The improvements represent an outlay of several thousand dollars and will be completed this year, unless something unforeseen transpires.

That there will be moving picture machines installed in some of the schools, especially the above named, is also very likely, in fact, this feature is being figured upon at present and the first installation of this character will doubtless be installed at the school at White Hall.

N. B. Lupton, well known Richmond architect and ex-county judge, is drawing the plans for the White Hall improvements, which will include, among other things, a library, four class rooms, a big assembly hall and a manual training department. The additional class rooms will place this building on a par with any other in the county. It is expected that the contract will be let within a short time and that actual work will soon be under way. The estimated cost of the change in this school will represent, it is said, between \$7,000 and \$8,000.

At the Science Hill school there will be additional rooms built for class work numbering two, a library, cloak room, manual training department and other improvements. The same additions will be made, it is reported at the Big Hill school, this work now being under way. With the completion of these improvements, most of the schools of the county will be in good condition and the capacity rendered adequate. It is the first time the moving picture feature has been introduced in the schools of the county. The progressive measure is being extensively used in city schools to a great advantage, instructors claiming they are highly beneficial.

The population of Cynthia, Harrison county, was announced as 3,857. The census figures show an increase of 254 since 1910, or seven per cent.

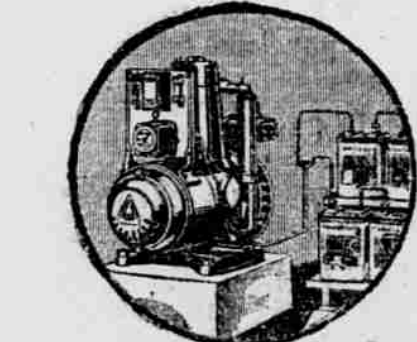

Cut the Weeds!

The Road Law of Kentucky makes it imperative that all owners, or controllers, or managers of lands, bordering on the public highways of this Commonwealth shall for the distance of their land borders on the highways, cut, clear away and remove from along side such roads all bushes, weeds, shrubs, overhanging limbs of trees, and all other obstructions and keep hedge fences that border along roads trimmed to not more than five feet high.

The law further provides that the work must be done between July 1st and August 20th of each year, under a penalty of conviction of a fine or from \$20 to \$50.

All such citizens of Madison county must take notice and comply with the provisions of this act.
