Now that cattle prices are not s good as they were a few years igo, the tendency on the part of the farmers is not to produce as much and not pay as much attention to producing good animals Now they are absolutely wrong n that contention. The lower you have to sell your cattle, the more you should strive to proluce the best. The best is the most economical to produce regardless of how they sell. Some one has said that you cannot get the farmers to see this. I have just been through the cattle pens of the Bourbon Stock Yards and made an effort to see every pen. It occurred to me that if it were possible to bring a large number of farmers, to believe that the scrub bull is as good as the pure bred, to the yards and take them through the cattle pens, there is no doubt but they would be convinced of their error. The pure bred stock from their condition and quality show clearly they are the most economical to produce.


