#### EDUCATIONAL ASSOCIATION.

Rev. Francis W. Howard, Secretary General of the Catholic Educational Association of the United States, was in New Orleans last week, and at a largely attended meeting, presided over by Archbishop Blenk, committees were named to arrange for the tenth annual convention of the national body. Besides many men prominent in the public life of New Orleans every pastor in the city was present. The convention will be held from June 20 to July 3, and the interest manifested points to the most successful meeting in the history of the association. Among those who will assist in the work of preparing for the convention are Dr. Felix Gaudin, Supreme President of the Catholic Knights of America, and Hon. Charles I. Denechaud, President of the American Federation of Catholic Societies.

#### JESUITS' BIG PURCHASE.

A 200-acre tract of the Belle Meade land, near Nashville, Tenn., known as the Red House field, has been bought by the Jesuits. The consideration was \$125,000. The tract in question adjoins the famous Belle Meade Deer Park. Great plans are under way for the improvement of the tract by the purchasers. It is stated that buildings to cost \$500,000 will be begun at once.

#### PETITION TO CARDINAL.

A petition has been forwarded from Australia to the Vatican, praying that if the Pope should see fit to appoint another Cardinal in Australia, his choice will fall on Archbishop Carr. It is stated that the petition will be signed by every Australian Archbishop and Bishop.

#### VATICAN PALACE.

The Palace of the Vatican contains the largest and most valuable residence and museum in the world. In the residential part are about 1,000 rooms, 200 of which serve as apartments for the Pope, the court officials and others. The number of printed books in the Vatican Library is estimated at not less than 350,000, exclusive of the enormous number of manuscripts, codices, etc.
