World War Has Exacted a Toll of 10,000,000 Lives While 30,000,000 Homes Have Been Galed and Darkened Since 1914

TURKEY DAY PROGRAM AT EXPOSITION PARK

Fast Boxing and Wrestling Bout Arranged for Athletic Matinee Starting at 3:00 O'Clock.

Members of the Fourth Field Artillery will provide a Thanksgiving Day program for Corpus Christi's tomorrow afternoon at Exposition Park, when a championship boxing-wrestling match will be staged between Mr. Hennifican of Bailey's, the champion boxer of the New England States, and Ed. French, who is too well known in Corpus Christi sporting and athletic circles for an introduction in this part of Texas.

Hennifican, the strongest boxer holds that he will introduce during the contest one who will prove a fast favorite. The compact French wrestler has won the reputation of being able to carry a 200-second bout of boxing or wrestling and has succeeded in pinning Hennifican's shoulders to the mat during the minute engagement.

The odds match will be preceded by a wrestling tilt between Private C. P. Russell of Bailey's, and George Corporal J. F. Morris of Bailey's. Morris weighs about ten pounds more than Russell but Russell has never been beaten by anyone within ten pounds of his own weight. This will be a 20-minute engagement.

This will be followed by a lively boxing bout between Billie Gerhard of Patters D. & E. P. Warner of Headquarters Company. Both weigh 125 pounds, and are as fast as lightning.

Lieutenant N. A. Jones, chaplain of the Fourth, who is in charge of the program, says that he can assure two 10-year-old Corps Christi lads who had a neighborhood quarrel sometime and who would like to settle their dispute with the gloves. Chaplain Jones has booked the youthful bellwethers for a preliminary.

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He will go to Washington about the middle of December.
