Cotton Duster to Combat Boll Weevil to Be Handled By Eastern Seed Company

Since the advent of the cotton boll weevil, growers throughout most of the South have been confronted with a very serious problem. As the cotton boll weevil is today costing the South millions of dollars. Numerous attempts have been made to control the pest, various states at times having forced large sums of money for a solution of the problem.
