VERMONT'S POPULATION.

A Special Census Bulletin Dealing With

A circular letter has been received by Deputy Collector Forbes from the United States internal revenue department an-nouncing that all special taxes heretofore trip tickets for half fare. required from dealers in and manufacturers of tonneco and cigars are abolished on and after May 1, 1801. Tobacco and cigar mau-ufacturers, peddlers of tobacco and dealers in leaf tobacco are, however, required by law to register with the deputy collector the facts concerning their business. The government year has been extended so as to close June 30 instead of April 30, and all special tax stamps expiring on the latter date this year must be renewed and pay ment made therefor for the period of months, from May 1 to July 1. Special tax stamps for the full year beginning July 1, must be taken out at that time.




