VERMONT'S POPULATION.

A special census bulletin dealing with Counties, Cities, Towns and Villages. A special census bulletin has been issued which gives the population of the State by counties, cities towns and villages, according to the official count of the returns of the 11th census as finally determined.

The total population of the State as reported in 1890 is 332,422, while the population in 1880 was 332,280, or an increase during the decade of only 142, or less than one-half of one per cent. Six counties, namely, Chittenden, Essex, Lamoille, Orleans, Rutland and Washington, show an increase of 12,112, while the population of the remaining counties has decreased 11,670.

The actual increase or decrease for each county, together with the corresponding percentage, is shown by the table below.

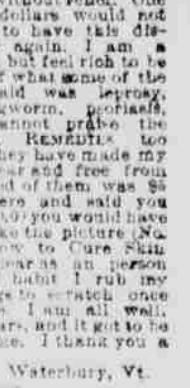
