Consider the vast amount of money that will be spent in the erection and furnishing of these buildings. It we predict that it will cost \$1,000,000 or more to complete these buildings we are safe in saying that the major part of the vast sum will find its way into the pockets of Butte and fAnaconda.

From the above it will be seen that Daly pinches his employes fron twenty-tive cents to a dollar a day each; quite a neat little sum per diem on three or four thousand employes; but that isn't all of it. In Butte-twenty-eight miles dis tant-the men not only get higher wages but they can take their money and go where they please to supply their needs In Anaconda there is no place to trade but in Daly's stores, and the "double cinch" on the poor workingmen is con plete. And still there are those who will maintain that Daly is "the friend of the workingman.
