### WARNING TO ROUNDUP CITIZENS

**Typhoid Fever Prevalent in Roundup--Rules to be Followed to Prevent Wholesale Epidemic**

Typhoid fever has gained a foothold in Roundup and is already assuming alarming propensities, in fact so many cases have been reported that vigorous steps will have to be pursued to prevent a wholesale epidemic of that dread disease. It is believed that the cause of the present epidemic lies in the fact that a large number of the crews of railroad laborers along the Musselshell river have been using the water of that stream, which has been unusually low the past season, for drinking purposes and in the preparation of their food. The disease once rooted among these laborers, who are mostly foreigners and unsanitary in their living, has had a chance to have full sway, and finally resulted in the spread of the disease.

In order to prevent the spread of the epidemic as much as possible and which will effectively aid in suppressing it, the following precautionary measures should be instituted and vigorously prosecuted by all citizens of Roundup.

1. All water, regardless of its source or apparent purity, should be boiled before being used for drinking purposes or for use about cooking or eating utensils.

2. All food should be effectually screened against flies. An epidemic of typhoid is frequently due to the contamination of flies, infection being carried from typhoid patients, their excreta and from privy vaults contaminated by convalescent patients or by mild cases who manage to wander about town, thus leaving new nests of infection in their wake.

3. Dishes should be kept screened against flies as closely as the food.

4. The use of lime in privy vaults and on seats that have been soiled is urged. Chlorinated lime is the best for the purpose. Allowing lime to slack in contact with the contents of vaults and seats answers the purpose well when the other is not available. The opening in the seats in all privies should be provided with covers to prevent a free interchange of flies when not in use.

The co-operation of all citizens is essential to success and the attention of merchants dealing in food supplies of all kinds, and hotel and restaurant keepers is especially called to these measures, as a large part of the population of Roundup is dependent upon the latter for the necessities of life.

The indiscriminate scattering of refuse or human excretions are practices that cannot be too vigorously condemned.

### WILL ORGANIZE

**Aerie of Eagles to be Organized in Roundup--Nearly 100 Signify Intention to Join.**

Arrangements are about completed for the organization of a local aerie of Eagles, about a hundred having signified their intention to join the order. Finlay McRae of Helena, Grand Treasurer of the Eagles, is expected here in the near future, probably some time next week, to organize the local aerie, and indications point that they will start out with a large membership here.

The Fraternal Order of Eagles is a relatively new order having been started about five years ago, and has grown from a "jest" to one of the foremost orders in the world in that short space of time. It now boasts of fifteen hundred aeries and a membership of more than 260,000.

The large registration was a surprise to everybody as up to the last day it had been figured that 150 would be the limit. There are still a number of qualified voters who failed to register as well as some who failed to get their transfers in time.

If every male resident of Roundup

over the age of 21 would have been allowed to register there would have been over 500 names on the books. The fact that so many of them have not been residents of the state for a year prevents them from voting.
