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"SUPERIOR" GAS USE QUESTIONED

In a report analyzing natural gas reserves, demand and other matters, made by the Standard Oil Co. (New Jersey) economics, research and producing staffs, it is pointed out that there is no "superior" use for natural gas to which it need be diverted at the expense of other uses. The report emphasizes, on the other hand, that rather than placing any restrictions on gas uses, a major problem of the industry is that of encouraging and developing wider use. The desirability of expanding the near future marketing of gas is strengthened, it is suggested, when the probability of eventual use of atomic and other basic sources of power is considered.

Asserting that there now exists sufficient gas for all known or contemplated needs over the forseeable future, the report declares that restrictions on exports from the producing states would benefit primarily the coal industry while backing up gas at the source with resulting tendency toward depressed price and waste.
