

# ORDINANCE NO. 9.

Be it ordained by the city council of Livingston City.

SEC. 1. The city council shall cause any street or any part of any street in this city, not less than sixteen rods in length, to be graded, paved, macadamized or otherwise improved, or any sidewalk or gutter to be built when a petition therefor in writing signed by at least a majority of all the resident owners of real estate bounding both sides, and the petitioners shall have paid one-half the cost of such street or part of street to be improved.

SEC. 2. On the petition of a majority of such resident owners and of the resident owners of at least one-half of the frontage of one side of any street or part of street not less than sixteen rods in length asking for the laying or construction of a sidewalk or gutter the city council shall order and cause to be laid, or constructed such sidewalk or gutter as may be prayed for, and the city council is hereby authorized to order any sidewalk or gutter previously built, to be put in repair when they shall deem the same necessary without any petition therefor.

SEC. 3. For the purpose of improving any street or building or repairing any sidewalk or gutter as provided in the two preceding sections, the city council shall levy and cause to be collected upon the lots, tracts or parcels of ground on such streets or part of street improved or on the side thereof where such sidewalk or gutter is built or constructed, and upon the owners thereof, a tax sufficient to pay the expenses of constructing such improvement as ordered, opposite such property, to the center of the street or such proportion thereof, not less than one-half, as the council shall deem justly assessable to such property, if the council shall think the whole ought not to be assessed against such property the remainder shall be paid for by this city.

SEC. 4. Every such tax for repairs as provided for in this ordinance, shall be for the entire cost of the repairs in front of the property assessed. If any tax levied under the provisions of this ordinance by the city council shall prove insufficient to pay the cost or proportion thereof assessed to such property, the city council shall levy an additional tax thereon, to make good such deficiency.

SEC. 5. Whenever the city council shall levy any such tax as provided for in this ordinance they shall make out and deliver to the street commissioner of this city, a list of all persons and a description of the property taxed, together with a warrant for the collection and expenditure of said tax, and thereupon the street commissioner shall notify the persons named in such tax list, by publishing a notice for two weeks in some newspaper published in this city.

SEC. 6. The street commissioner shall specify in the notice mentioned in the preceding section, at the time or times not less than twenty days nor more than forty days from the date thereof, when the persons charged with such taxes in such list, may pay their taxes in labor material or money.

SEC. 7. All persons charged with such tax as herein provided, may at such time and place as may be required or directed, by the street commissioner pay their said taxes in labor or material, provided however, that the labor and material offered in payment of such taxes are such as may be required by the street commissioner, and done or furnished to his satisfaction and at the market rates then prevailing.

SEC. 8. At the expiration of forty days from the date of the notice mentioned in sections 5 and 6 of this ordinance, the street commissioner shall make out and deliver to the County Clerk of Park county, a certified list of the lots, pieces or tracts of land in this city upon which any such tax remains unpaid, with the amount of such delinquent tax upon each of said lots or parcels of land, for collection by the County Treasurer of Park county, as provided by law.

SEC. 9. Whenever any lot, tract or parcel of land shall have been returned delinquent by the street commissioner for any tax as hereinbefore provided, the city council may cause the work to be done, at the expense of the city, to be reimbursed by such tax when collected.

SEC. 10. Whenever the public convenience or safety shall require any sidewalk or gutter in case of injury or defect, to be immediately repaired, and the cost of repairs will not exceed ten dollars, the street commissioner may give written notice to the parties or their agents, subject to tax for the repairs thereof, if known and residing in this city, and if unknown or not residents of this city, then by posting written notices in three public places in this city.

SEC. 11. The notice to non-residents as provided in the preceding section shall state that unless such sidewalk or gutter thereon is repaired by the parties to the satisfaction of the street commissioner within three days thereafter he will repair the same at the expense of the property, describing it, and if the same in such case be not repaired the street commissioner shall repair the same and return the tax as a delinquent tax on such property, and the same shall be returned and collected as other delinquent taxes hereinbefore provided.

SEC. 12. The street commissioner shall be provided with a memorandum book, in which it shall be his duty to keep an account of all money's coming into his hands by virtue of his office, the amount received and disbursed by him, the name of every person from whom money or labor is due, the amount paid in money and labor, and an account of all expenditures made by him as street commissioner.

SEC. 13. The book provided for in the preceding section containing the amounts so received and expended by the street commissioner shall at all times when required, be furnished for the inspection of the city council, and ten days before the expiration of his term of office, the street commissioner shall deliver said book to the city clerk to be filed in his office for the inspection of the tax-payers of this city.

# ORDINANCE NO. 10.

Adopting a corporate seal for the City of Livingston.

Be it ordained by the city council of Livingston City.

SEC. 1. That a seal of circular form with the words "City of Livingston Territory of Montana" on the edge of said circle and having in the center thereof the word "Seal" and underneath the date 1889. Is hereby adopted and declared to be the corporate seal of the City of Livingston, to be used in all cases in which a seal is necessary to be used by said corporation.

The Rocky Fork Coal company are putting in scales and pushing the work and will soon be in readiness to furnish 1,000 tons of coal per day. Competent miners can get work here any day.

Sheriff Templeton made us a visit the past week in the interests of the people, his special mission being to show the residents of the panhandle wherein it was to their interests to remain in Park county, and he found them almost all of one mind, that they had made a mistake and acted without due deliberation in asking to leave Park county, with its good roads, free bridges and low taxes. They were only waiting to sign a remonstrance and needed no urging.

In view of our coming prosperity, with the Rocky Fork road we are assured of the greatest coal camp in the northwest, and with the franchise of the B. C. F. & C. C. company in the hands of the U. P. we are assured the time is short until these coal fields will be tapped on the east side and thus insure just as great a coal camp at Carbonade as Red Lodge. Then we will have sufficient wealth and population to manage our own affairs; till then let well enough alone is the sentiment of nine out of every ten residents of the panhandle at the present time.

With the opening of our coal fields we need and must have a resident deputy sheriff, as our interests would inevitably suffer if we must wait for a sheriff to come from Livingston every time his services are required. In the person of Mr. Frank Beller we have the material for as competent a deputy sheriff as can be sent here, and we earnestly recommend him to the attention of our worthy sheriff. 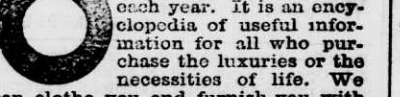
