For the purpose of improving any street or building or repairing any sidewalk or gutter as provided in the two preceding sections, the city council shall levy and cause to be collected upon the lots tracts or parcels of ground on such streets or part of street improved or on the side thereof where such sidewalk or gutter is built or constructed, and upon the owners thereof, a tax sufficient to pay the ex-penses of constructing such improvement as ordered, opposite such pronot to be assessed against such pro-perty the remainder shall be paid for
