## LET THE HONOR AND INTEGRITY OF THE BENCH BE SUSTAINED.

In their election of Delegates to the State Convention we trust that the Republicans of Ormsby county may secure such a representation as will give a hearty and constant support to the proposition of re-nominating Hon. James F. Lewis to the Supreme Bench. We hold that there is no matter which will come up for decision by the Republican party in convention assembled that can be regarded as of more importance than this. The "one term principle" (which is a humbug at best) does not apply, even in a remote degree, to the incumbency of judicial positions; and it would be an exhibition of the very worst judgment for the Republican party to rotate this very accomplished gentleman out of office in order to make room for any one who might offer himself as his competitor for the nomination.

## LET US HAVE PEACE.

We noticed a good many ward politicians from Storey county on our streets yesterday. They came here, no doubt, to take part in giving a direction to the primaries which take place to-day. Now, while we hope that no aspirant to distinguishing honors at the hands of the Republican party has had the very bad taste to induce these men to come here, we also hope that there may be no meddling by these outsiders with the matters which solely concern the Republicans of Ormsby county. And we further ask, in the name of the Republican party and its interests that there may be no wrangling at the polls. There need not be if all hands are determined that this election shall be fairly and honorably conducted.

It is a little suspicious that the managers of Mr. Jones' fight here should take their printing (of tickets) to a Democratic paper. The conductors of the APPEAL do not violate professional confidence; and it is not asserted, we believe, that we are not quite as much entitled to the patronage of Republicans as the conductor of a Democratic organ. We are not finding fault, however; but we merely mention this matter as something in the way of news.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN?—We noticed yesterday and last evening that certain active agents of John P. Jones were suspiciously "thick" with the seceders from the Republican party—Chedie, Wells & Co. What does this mean? Does the natural inference which is to be derived from this fact, account for the singular silence of the Enterprise concerning Clarke & Co, which has characterized that paper since Dagget left it?

We cannot believe that so ardent a Republican as John P. Jones has employed so flagrant a deserter and busy a Greeleyite as George Chedie to canvass this precinct in his interest. Moreover, we cannot credit the malicious rumor that Bob Clarke writes editorials in favor of Jones for the Register and also manages his, Jones', fight! oh no!!
