AN ORDINANCE. AN ORDINANCE to Establish a Uniform Grade and Width for Sidewalks bounding Blocks T and S on Bridge Street, in the Town of Winnemucca, Nevada, and other matters relating

The Board of County Commissioners

of Humboldt County, Etate of Nevada,

do ordain as follows: Section 1. The sidewalks bounding Backs and S. on Bridge street, in the Town of Winnemucca, Humboldt County, State of Nevada, shall be ten feet in width with two inches fall from the grade hereinafter established, to said

Section 2. The grade of said side walks shall be a fall of five feet from the Northerly side of Third Street to the Southerly side of Second Street in

Section 3. The sidewalks named in this ordinance shall be of incombustible

ma:terial. Section 4. Any person, or persons, firm, association, partnership, or corporation who shall construct, or cause to be constructed, or assist in the construction of any sidewalk contrary to the provisions of this ord nance, or shall maintain and refuse to remove any dewa k cons ructed contrary to the provisions of this ordinance for the pe r'od of five days, after receiving not ce to remove the same by the Fire Warden of said town, shall upon conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of a misde meanor, and be fined in any sum no greater than \$100, or be imprisoned in the county jail of said county for not more than Thirty days, or be both fined and imprisoned at the discretion of the

Section 4. All fines, together with al costs of action imposed or arising in or upon prosecutions for the enforcemen of this ordinance shall be a lien upor the lot or lots abutting the sidewalk cosntructed contrary to the provisions

Section 5. It is hereby made the duty of the Fire Warden of said town, to exam'ne all sidewalks hereafter constructed within the limits defined by Section 1, of this ordinance, and tear ut and remove all sdewalks constructed contrary to the provisions of this ordi nance, and to institute prosecutions for all violations of the provisions of the same, and he shall be allowed a fee of \$25 for each conviction, in addition to other costs to be collected from the de-

This ordinance shall take effect from and after October 11th, 1905.
