AN ORDINANCE.
AN ORDINANCE to Establish a Uniform Grade and Width for Sidewalks bounding Blocks T and S on Bridge Street, in the Town of Winnemucca, Nevada, and other matters relating thereto.
The Board of County Commissioners

of Humboldt County, State of Nevada, do ordain as follows:
Section 1. The sidewalks bounding Blocks T and S on Bridge Street, in the Town of Winnemucca, Humboldt County, State of Nevada, shall be ten feet in width with two inches fall from the grade hereinafter established, to said street.
Section 2. The grade of said sidewalks shall be a fall of five feet from the Northernly side of Third Street to the Southernly side of Second Street in said town.
Section 3. The sidewalks named in this ordinance shall be of incombustible material.
Section 4. Any person, or persons, firm, association, partnership, or corporation who shall construct, or cause to be constructed, or assist in the construction of any sidewalk contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, or shall maintain and refuse to remove any sidewalk constructed contrary to the provisions of this ordinance for the period of five days, after receiving notice to remove the same by the Fire Warden of said town, shall upon conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and be fined in any sum not greater than \$100, or be imprisoned in the county jail of said county for not more than Thirty days, or be both fined and imprisoned at the discretion of the court.
Section 4. All fines, together with all costs of action imposed or arising in or upon prosecutions for the enforcement of this ordinance shall be a lien upon the lot or lots abutting the sidewalk constructed contrary to the provisions hereof.
Section 5. It is hereby made the duty of the Fire Warden of said town, to examine all sidewalks hereafter constructed within the limits defined by Section 1. of this ordinance, and tear up and remove all sidewalks constructed contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, and to institute prosecutions for all violations of the provisions of the same, and he shall be allowed a fee of \$25 for each conviction, in addition to other costs to be collected from the defendant.
This ordinance shall take effect from and after October 11th, 1905.
