Transplanting - Many shrubs are A home could be attractively planted stunted by careless planting. The hole in which the shrub is to be placed should be deep enough so that good loam may be filled in for the new roots to feed upon and the shrub placed at the same depth it was before. It should also be wide enough for the roots to be well spread out. The shrub should be placed erect and the soil thoroughly packed around the roots. To balance the loss of roots, half of the branches should be removed at time of planting.

Pruning-The shrubs and vines used to beautify the home should require very little care or attention other than the removal of old, dead, broken, or rubbing branches.

Shrubs in the back yard to be used as screens or to supply flowers should be pruned as follows: Spring flowering) shrubs, such as forsythia, should be pruned immediately after blooming. Summer and fall flowering shrubs, such as roses, should be severely pruned in
