Will C. Higgins, editor of the Mining Review of Salt Lake, who is recognized as an authority on mining, says that Nevada is the richest mining territory in the world. "The eyes of the entire country are turning toward Nevada," he says, "and the next few years will see a development in your State that will surpass all her past mining achievements."

Mr. Higgins says that in his opinion the San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake road, now being constructed, will open up many new camps of great richness in Nevada. "It will also reopen many old camps," he said, "that were abandoned many years ago on account of the depreciation in the price of silver. In the days gone by these camps were operated at a great profit, although their ores were hauled for long distances across mountain and plain to the smelters. With the advent of the railroad and the new process of treating ores, their product can now be mined at a great profit, as you will see for yourself when the new road opens for traffic." Mr. Higgins said that the officials of the road at Los Angeles claimed that it would be opened by January 1st.

Granted a New Trial.

The four men convicted of murder from Humboldt county were granted a new trial this week by the Supreme Court. The reason was that a juror named Berry was allowed to serve after he had expressed an unqualified opinion as to the guilt or innocence of the accused. The juror was challenged but the court allowed him to serve after he had sworn that any opinion he had could be removed by evidence and that he was ready to give accused a fair trial. This means that the men who have been expecting to hang together at the State's Prison at an early date will have their cases all tried over again.

Tonopah Railroad.

Very good progress has been made by the track-laying forces during the week just passed, and by to-night the road should be within seven miles of Tonopah. The stage station was moved to Goldfield Junction Friday and a freight station was established there to-day. All necessary facilities will be provided for prompt handling of both freight and passengers — Bonanza.

Death of J. R. Ryan.

Hon. J. R. Ryan, Democratic National Committeeman for Nevada, and a delegate to the Democratic National Convention, died at the Jefferson Hotel, St. Louis, on Friday morning, July 1st, from an attack of pneumonia. His remains will be shipped to San Francisco for interment.

Mr. Ryan was one of Nevada's most popular men and his death will be keenly felt throughout the State, and particularly on the Comstock, where for a number of years he had been a well beloved mining superintendent.

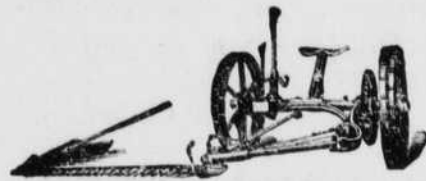
