Mr. Mill's posthumous work, "Nature, The Utility of Religion, and Theism," is the subject of the first article. Those who have never read this work will find here a summary of the author's opinions on natural religion, the immortality of the soul, and the claims of revelation; and the essays are welcomed for their "clear, concise and intelligible treatment of old problems," and for their "convincing originality."

"The Bible and Strong Drink" is a short article showing the probable effect of the passage of a bill, preventing the sale, manufacture, possession, or transportation of intoxicating liquors in England, and that the use of wine is not only permitted, but enjoined in the Bible.

"Rocks Ahead, or the Warnings of Cassandra" is the review of a recent work by Mr. Greg, which is remarkable alike for the gloomy views it depicts and the great ability with which it is written. It portrays the difficulties likely to arise from the parliamentary reform of the country becoming more and more, members, in some sort, of the aristocracy.

"Aristotle," the work which occupied the last six years of Mr. Grote's life, has just been given to the public, and is the subject of this essay. The scope of this work, as well as those of Plato and the companions of Socrates, which preceded it, is to show the speculative activity of the Greeks, by a critical examination of the works of their chief thinkers." It begins with a sketch of the life of Aristotle, an account of the spirit, in which there are few dissenting lists, but an analysis of a few of them. This analytical part of the work was terminated abruptly by the author's death, and is therefore very incomplete. The present article is devoted principally to his treatment of the treatises known as the Organon.

"Charity, Pauperism, and Self-Help" is a modification of the English Poor Law, and sets forth the plan for a Friendly Relief Society. "The First Metallurgists" is an antiquarian article. It mentions the traces left by primitive man in the shape of smelted iron, which we find in all parts of the world, and the gradual advance in civilization proclaimed by their contents. It is probable that the Neanderthals, who were dwellers in caves, were the first discoverers of metals, and the appearance of the serpent symbol in all places is interestingly commented on. The supposed case of the "warrior chief," a native of the West Indies, who was attacked by a rattlesnake, and whose body was covered with a yellowish yellow, is also commented on, but we cannot help thinking that his thought, "Surely this stone, as I turned it round, etc., was made by the bite of a snake," is an unforced inference.
