TURKEY SURRENDERS UNCONDITIONALLY Germany Now Has War Councils' Terms For An Armistice WHOLE ITALIAN FRONT IS TODAY ABLAZE

The capture of Monte Cison also divides the Austrian army, forcing the troops to the north to follow the long, slow line of retreat through the mountains of Trentino.

Couldn't Defend Fiume.

PARIS, Oct. 31.—The military governor at Fiume recently advised the Hungarian government that he was without ammunition and was unable to defend the city. He received orders to hand over the administration to the Croatian National Council, which he did immediately.

Communication Cut.

PARIS, Oct. 31.—Communication between Agram and Fiume and Budapest and Vienna has been totally interrupted. The Czecho-Slovaks have cut the railroad between Berlin and Vienna near Bodenbach and German trains can go only as far as Schmudt, according to a Zurich dispatch.

Austrian Divisions Cut Off.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31.—Fifteen Austrian divisions operating between Brenta and the Piave on the Italian front have had their retreat cut off through the capture of a mountain pass of Vandal by Italian and Allied forces.
