THE INTERNATIONAL AND GREAT SOUTHERN.

Will Apply For a Charter and Then On to Brownsville.

A reporter for the Express was informed yesterday by a gentleman in a position to know that the gentlemen connected with the proposed International and Great Southern Railway had perfected financial arrangements in the last week and that a charter would be taken out during the coming week.

It will be remembered that subscriptions amounting to \$30,000 or \$40,000 were secured as a bonus to this road last summer, and that on account of the great railroad strike work on the matter was temporarily abandoned.

The proposed road will run south from San Antonio to a point on the Rio Grande, thence to Soto de la Marina and Tampico to the City of Mexico. The reporter was informed that the matter of subscriptions to the bonus of the company would be taken up where the work was left off last summer.

The reporter was further informed that the incorporators and directors of the road would be composed of some of the leading business men and citizens of San Antonio.—San Antonio Express.
