A Costly Razor.

For the theft of a razor which he sold for fifty cents Gilbert McCoy, a young negro, must serve a term of five years in the penitentiary. This penalty was imposed against the defendant yesterday afternoon by a jury after a very short deliberation. There is one more case of burglary pending against the defendant.

Several residences were burglarized in Waxahachie last winter and McCoy is believed to be the party guilty of the offenses. When arrested he had in his possession several articles that were identified as belonging to persons whose houses had been entered.

As soon as the above case was disposed of the case of the state against George Mason, charged by indictment with theft from the person, was called for trial. Mason's attorney filed an application for a change of venue, alleging that on account of prejudice against the defendant he could not get a fair trial in Ellis county. All the forenoon today was devoted to taking evidence on the proposition to have the case transferred to another county. At two o'clock this afternoon the application for a change of venue was overruled. A motion was then made to have the case postponed on account of the illness of one of the defendant's attorneys. This motion was likewise overruled, and the trial of the case was commenced.

Returns of Election.

No business of any special importance came up before the city council last night for consideration. The returns of the bond election held April 1 were canvassed, with the following result: For the issuance of bonds 143. Against the issuance of bonds 23.

The reports of committees and officers were then received and approved.

A special meeting of the council was held at 9 o'clock this morning for the purpose of counting the votes cast in yesterday's election. The count showed that only 151 votes were polled in the three wards. The new officers are as follows: Marshal, Tom Dixon; attorney, A. L. Love; secretary, Geo. W. Walker, Jr.; treasurer, Frank Getzendaner; assessor and collector, C. T. Spalding; alderman ward 1, D. G. Thompson; alderman ward 2, W. L. P. Leigh; alderman ward 3, J. M. Lancaster.

Out of respect to Mr. S. P. Langsford, who is a member of the council and chairman of the finance committee, the mayor and board of aldermen met at the city hall at 2 o'clock to attend the funeral of Mrs. Langsford in a body.
