WATCH IS 308 YEARS OLD.

Is Carried by Direct Descendant of Man Who Brought It Here in 1634.

Alta Loma, Tex., Dec. 8.—Reuben S. Price of Alta Loma is the owner of what is said to be the first watch ever brought to America of which there is any authentic record. It is a solid silver chronometer, about the diameter of the ordinary watch of today, but several times as thick. It was made in Liverpool, England, by Richard D. Baner in the year 1600. It is said to be absolutely hand made.

This remarkable watch was brought to Maryland in 1634, in either the Ark or the Dove, two of the ships sent by Lord Baltimore to his brother, governor of the settlement of Maryland, by Mr. Price's great-great-great-great-great-grandfather, and has since the year 1634 been worn by the eldest son, in direct descent. Engraved upon the inner side of the case is the following inscription:

"I was brought to St. Mary's, Maryland, 1634, by Mordcael Price Jr.; 1781, his son, Elijah Price; 1830, his son, John K. Price; 1862, his son, Reuben S. Price." Notwithstanding the fact that it is 308 years old, it still keeps correct time and is in constant use.

HOUSE IS BLOWN AWAY.

Man Who Went Up in the Air With House Came Down Again.

Mena, Ark., Dec. 5.—Of the queer pranks of the tornado which swept the western part of the state last week, that which was played on G. Erick is perhaps the oddest.

He was standing looking out of the window watching the storm, when he felt himself and the house suddenly lifted in the air. He returned to earth but the house never did.

High in a treetop he saw a bed spread flapping in the wind. An open kettle, in which he had put a pound of coffee, was found fifty feet from where the house stood, and none of the coffee was missing. His watch, which hung on a nail in the house, was found still further away. The chain was missing, but the watch was still keeping good time.
