Freeman acknowledges that he is the man wanted and says he will return to Mississippi without requisition.

He says he killed Downey in 1905 for making improper remarks about his (Freeman's) wife. Freeman was working in a cotton factory at West, Texas, when arrested, and had not changed his name.

Mrs. Freeman, over whom the killing is claimed to have occurred, died Monday of this week.

ARREST IN MAIL ROBBERY CASE.

Young White Man Cashed an Express Money Order.

Bryan, Texas, Feb. 7.—An arrest

has been made here by Deputy Sheriff J. D. Conlee growing out of the Temple-Waco mail robbery the latter part of December, when it is alleged, a mail bag was stolen from the trucks at Temple and found rifled next morning near Waco, with post-office and express money orders missing. Two days later an express money order for \$79.53, said to have been issued at San Angelo in favor of the Wise county tax collector, was cashed by a party at the Wells Fargo Express office at Navasota. The Navasota agent, Mr. E. P. Butler, was here today, and identified the young white man under arrest as the man who cashed the order. It is understood that Postoffice Inspector Bass of Waco, who was here yesterday, working on the case with Deputy Sheriff Conlee, will go to Houston tonight and lodge complaint in the federal court.
