JOHN H. REAGAN STATUE

Arrived in Galveston Yesterday and Will Be Shipped to Palestine to Be Erected.

Galveston News.

The bronze statue of John H. Reagan, which the Daughters of the Confederacy had executed by Pompeo Coppini, the Italian sculptor, arrived in Galveston on the steamer Irak and was unloaded yesterday morning for shipment to Palestine, Texas, where it will be erected and unveiled shortly. It had been the intention to unveil this monument on October 8, the anniversary of Reagan's birth, but it is a question now as to whether the statue can be taken to Palestine and erected in time for the unveiling on the 8th.

The statue is larger than life size, and represents the great Southern statesman in the attitude of standing just in front of his chair addressing an audience. His left hand is raised in gesture and in his right he holds a manuscript or document.

The statue is well incased for shipment and is consigned to the J. H. Reagan monument committee, Palestine, Texas. Of this committee Miss Coral Ozment is president. The funds for this statue were raised by the monument committee of the Daughters of the Confederacy.

A figure will be grouped near the statue, and the beautiful inscription, also in bronze, will be placed on the base.

The inscription of the plate is as follows:
