MISS NIGHTINGALE IS 89

Heroine of the Crimean War Entered
Upon Her Ninetieth Year This
Week—In Poor Health.

London, May 15.—Florence Nightingale, the heroine of the Crimea, entered upon her ninetieth year this week and was the recipient of congratulatory messages that came from nearly all parts of the world. For close on to fifty years the famous nurse has lived in quiet retirement in her home near Park Lane. For the last fifteen years she has been confined to her bed the most of the time by illness.

Born at Florence, of wealthy English parents, Miss Nightingale at the age of twenty-two entered the institution of Protestant Deaconesses at Kaiserswerth to be trained as a nurse. From there she went to the Sisters of St. Vincent de Paul, Paris, to study their methods of nursing and hospital management. In England, before she started for the Crimea, she reorganized the Harley Street Hospital in London, and on her return from the war in 1856 she established training colleges for nurses at St. Thomas's and King's College Hospitals. Despite her great age and physical infirmities her mind is still alert and active and she continues to follow modern developments in the nursing profession with the keenest interest.
