lish parents, Miss Nightingale at the

Kaiserwerth to be trained as a nurse

From there she went to the Sisters of

St. Vincent de Paul, Paris, to study

their methods of nursing and hospital

management. In England, before she

started for the Crimea, she reorgan-

ized the Harley Street Hospital in

London, and on her return from the

war in 1856 she established training

colleges for nurses at St. Thomas's

and King's College Hospitals. Despite

her great age and physical infirmities

her mind is still alert and active and

she continues to follow modern de-

velopments in the nursing profession
