## WAS KILLED IN JAIL BY MOB

Mob Tried to Get Prisoner Out of Cell, and  
Failing He Was Filled With Lead.

(Herald Special.)

Abilene, Texas, May 28.—After an hour's desperate attempt to batter down a cell door at the county jail, a mob at two o'clock this morning fired into the cell, shooting to death Tom Barnett, who was recently convicted of the killing of Alex Sears, a prominent West Texas cattleman.

There were forty men in the mob, and they went about their work in a determined way, and without demonstration. Jailor Peevey resisted the mob, which fell upon him and overpowered him. He put up a good fight, however, and his back was wrenched, and he was otherwise injured.

Finishing with Peevey, the mob sought the keys, but failed to find them. Then they made a rush to

Barnett's cell, but all efforts to pry open or break down the door proved futile. Barnett was then called upon to stand up and face the mob. While he was in the act of rising a volley of shots were emptied into his body, fifteen shots taking effect. He died immediately.

Alex Sears was a Jones county stockman, and was robbed and killed in this city, and the body carried to a school house in Callahan county, where it was burned. This crime took place February first of this year.

Barnett was soon thereafter arrested, charged with the crime. His trial ended April 4, and a jury found him guilty and gave him ninety-nine years in the penitentiary. A motion for a new trial was overruled, and the case was appealed.

## WILL BE TRIED IN THE FALL

Gov. Haskell and Five Others Will Have to Answer  
to Charges of Fraud in Land Cases.

Tulsa, Okla., May 28.—The trial of Governor Haskell and five others of the federal grand jury for conspiracy to defraud the government of lands, will probably be held in the fall. All the defendants, however, are likely to be arraigned at McAlistler next month, at which time another motion will be offered to quash the indictments. But it is generally expected the indictments will stand this time, and that the men will be tried on the merits

of the cases. The indictments cover a hundred and fifteen offenses. Besides Haskell those indicted are: Walter Eaton, W. T. Hutchings, C. B. Turner, F. B. Severs and A. E. English, all prominent and wealthy citizens.

It is believed the defense will plead that there was fraud only in the letter and not in the spirit. The case will be one of the largest ever tried before the government, and a thousand or more witnesses will be called from all parts of the country.

## APPLY FOR MANDAMUS

To Compel Attorney General Davidson to Approve Issue of Bonds From Hidalgo County.

Austin, Texas, May 28.—Application for mandamus was filed in the supreme court today to compel Attorney General Davidson to approve an issue of \$175,000 bonds of Hidalgo county, which Assistant Attorney General Sinder refused to approve, holding that the drainage act of the Thirtieth legislature is unconstitutional.

NOT CONNECTED AT ALL.

## STATE WANTS MORE COIN

District Judge Wilcox Directs That Receiver Eckhardt Pay to State an Additional \$200,000.

Austin, Texas, May 28.—District Judge Wilcox today directed Receiver Eckhardt of the Waters Pierce Oil company to pay to the state \$200,000 in addition to the fine of \$1,800,000 already received, as costs of the state in prosecuting the corporation.

## HOGUE WAS CONVICTED

Of Perjury in the Federal Court at Dallas—Committed to Jail to Await Sentence.

Dallas, Texas, May 27.—The jury in the United States district court this afternoon about 4 o'clock returned a verdict of guilty in the case of W. J. Hogue, charged with perjury. Hogue was at once committed to the Dallas county jail as a federal prisoner. Judge Meek will pass the sentence fixing the term of punishment.

Judge Meek late this afternoon ruled in favor of the three indicted officers of the suspended Western Bank and Trust company of Dallas in their contention that they be not committed to the custody of the United States marshal pending the trial of their cases; that they are entitled to their liberty on bond until they have been convicted. It is expected that the trial of these cases will be begun tomorrow before Judge Meek.

CLOUDBURST IN WEST.

Glasscock, Sterling and Tom Green Counties Report Damage.

San Angelo, Texas, May 28.—Swelled by cloudbursts in Glasscock, Sterling and Tom Green counties, the North Concho river here today reached a height of thirty-five feet, touching the London hotel. Farms have been overflowed, crops ruined, and much other damage done by high water, but no loss of life is reported.
