## BRIDGE RIO GRANDE.

I. & G. N. to Start Work on \$500,000 Viaduct.

Laredo, Texas, Feb. 2.—Work will begin within a few days on the new \$500,000 International and Great Northern bridge which is to span the Rio Grande at this point. It is to be one of the finest railroad bridges of its size in the south. On account of international complications the matter of starting work on the bridge was somewhat delayed, but now as all arrangements have been completed the officials of the National Lines of Mexico and the International and Great Northern say that work will start as soon as material can be put on the ground. It is understood that the bridge will be built wide enough for double tracks, which fact is believed to be very significant relating to future railroad progress.

## LAUNCH BOOM FOR LOVE

For Governor—Campbell Indorses the Sentiment.

Austin, Texas, Feb. 2.—A boom for Love for governor was launched at the farewell banquet last night, when the prediction of T. H. McGregor, his close friend, that the people will call Love to the executive chair was followed by a similar statement from Governor Campbell. Love, in responding, said he had no thought "at this time" of running for any office, but "am not burning any bridges behind me or swearing off." In view of the rumors that the retiring commissioner is being groomed for the race four years hence, the statements of the governor, McGregor and T. W. Gregory are regarded as peculiarly significant.

Dallas, Texas, Feb. 2.—Friends here of T. B. Love deny he will run for governor. Mr. Love has made business engagements, it is declared, which preclude him from making the race. He is expected to arrive here tomorrow.
