TWENTY-FIVE ARE KILLED

In a Wreck on the Rock Island Railroad This Morning Was Double Header and Both Engines Left Track.

(Herald Special.)
Chicago, Ill., March 21.—Twenty-five people are reported to be dead as the result of a wreck on the Rock Island railroad near Reinbeck this morning. The Rock Island was detouring its trains over the Great Western road on account of another wreck on its own lines. The wrecked train was a double-header and both engines with the train went into the

ditch. All of the enginemen are thought to be dead. Fourteen bodies have so far been recovered from the wreckage. One baggage car, one chair car and one sleeper were destroyed, and most of the injured passengers were in the chair car. Officers of the company have started an investigation, and say they are hopeful that the death list is not as large as has been reported.

CONGRESS IS REAL BUSY PROPOSITION REJECTED

Washington, D. C., March 21.—Members of congress are today arranging affairs to meet the new conditions brought about by the creation of a new committee on rules. Party caucuses to select the new members of the rules committee will be held tonight, and it is evident that the new committee is in line for some very hard work. Many delicate questions held back by the Cannon rules will now come forward for action. It is claimed that the present committee has measures on which no action has been taken because the speaker believed it bad politics. The parcels post resolution, introduced by Representative Fish of New York is one of them.

Carmen of Philadelphia Turned Down Traction Company's Offer of Compromise.

The committee representing the company and the strikers' executive committee split owing to the refusal of the company to recognize the grievance committee of the strikers. The employees deny the claim of the company that it shall prevent the strikers presenting their grievance.

Government Also Filed Bill For Dissolution of National Packing Company.

No indictments were returned against individual officers of the packing companies. Simultaneously with the action of the grand jury the government filed a bill in chancery for the dissolution of the National Packing company.

A deadlock is still on between the firemen and the managers. Neill has announced that unless an agreement is reached today he will withdraw from the case.

LEATHER WORKERS STRIKE.

Want Eight Hours and Fifteen Per Cent Increase.

Minneapolis, Minn., March 21.—The leather workers are on strike here, and the strike is general, reaching St. Louis and Texas points. The men ask for an eight-hour working day and a fifteen per cent increase in the wage scale.

ROOSEVELTS IN EGYPT

Party Left For Luxor, Where Two Days Will Be Spent—Roosevelt Still Saws Wood.

Shellal, Egypt, March 21.—Colonel Roosevelt left here this morning, going to Luxor, where he will spend two days visiting places of interest. The colonel is still overwhelmed with mail. The trip from here was made via regular train and the party suffered much inconvenience, but Luxor is preparing to give the distinguished visitors a characteristic reception and entertainment.

GRAFTERS CONFESS.

Five Former Members of Pittsburg Council Make Confessions.

Pittsburg, Pa., March 21.—Five former city councilmen and one present member today confessed to Judge Frazier in open court to having been connected with the council grafting. The men will be indicted this afternoon and sentences suspended.

Cotton Figures Compared.

Washington, D. C., March 21.—Today the census bureau's cotton report shows the crop of 1909 to have been 10,362,240 bales, compared with 13,432,240 bales for 1908. The average gross weight of bales for 1909 was 496, while for 1908 it was 505.8.
