To Whom It May Concern:

Notice is hereby given that application will be made by me to the next called session of the Thirty-First Legislature for the enactment of a special law for Anderson county, providing that no saloon or place where spirituous, vinous or malt liquors, or medicated bitters capable of producing intoxication are sold, or kept for sale, shall be in Precinct No. One, of Anderson county, within one mile of a church or school; provided, that the following streets and localities are exempt from this act:

Spring street, between Tennessee avenue and Houston street; Main street and Oak street, between Tennessee avenue and their intersection with Avenue A; North Sycamore street between the I. & G. N. railroad and Spring street; Avenue A and that portion of Church street between the intersection of Avenue A with the same and Lacy street, the same being that portion forming the west side of the public square.

Spring street between Tennessee avenue and Houston street; Main street and Oak street, between Tennessee avenue and their intersection with Avenue A; North Sycamore street between the I. & G. N. railroad and Spring street; Avenue A and that portion of Church street between the intersection of Avenue A with the same, and Lacy street, the same being that portion forming the west side of the public square.

HAWKINS LOST HIS JOB.

Senators By Vote of 22 to 7 Refused to Confirm His Nomination.

Austin, Texas, Aug. 1.—The senate today refused to confirm the appointment of Wm. E. Hawkins as commissioner of insurance and banking by a vote of 22 to 7.

It required only 21 or two-thirds in order not to confirm the appointment.

The senate then recessed until 3 o'clock this afternoon, when it is expected the governor will submit the name of a successor to Hawkins, but who it will be has not as yet been disclosed.

Breakfast bacon is said to be almost a cure for dyspepsia, and is one of the best things a dyspeptic can eat.

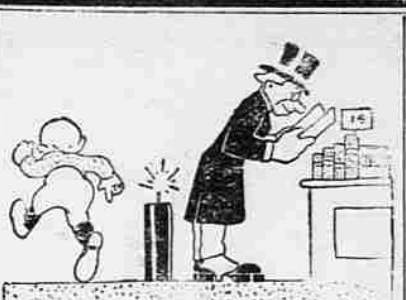
All impurities in a barrel of water will be sent to the bottom by sprinkling a tablespoonful of powdered alum into it.

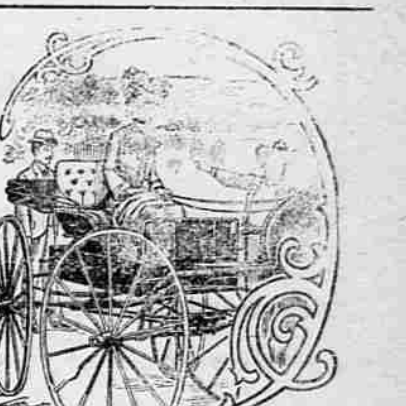
