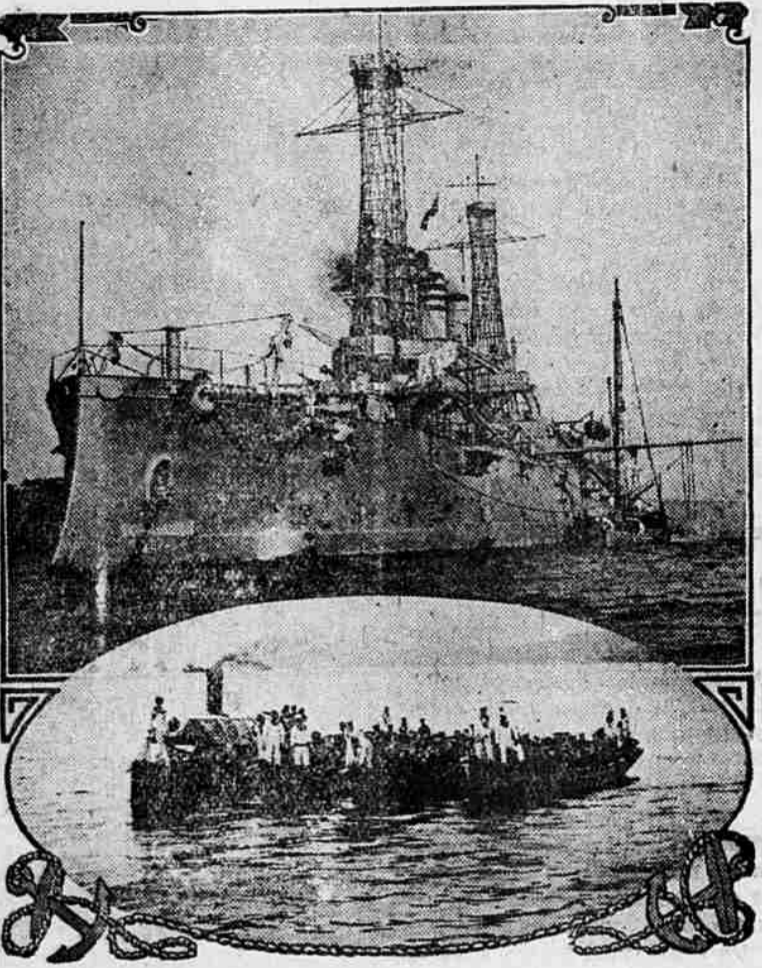

## Battleship New Hampshire And Liberty Party Going Ashore



One of the most serious disasters that ever befell the members of a crew of a United States battleship in time of peace was the swamping of a cutter of the New Hampshire in the Hudson river recently while the big fighting vessel was lying at anchor off the New York shore. Nearly thirty lives were lost when the boat was swamped by the wave of a passing barge. The cutter was loaded with nearly a hundred of the sailors and marines who had been enjoying shore liberty for a day, and in some manner not fully explained all were thrown into the water. Darkness made the work of rescue difficult, which, together with a strong tide running at the time, caused the fearful loss of life. For several days after the tragedy the river was dragged with little success. The officers of the warship fleet anchored in the Hudson called a board of inquiry immediately after the accident, but beyond the fact that a wave from the barge was responsible no blame was attached to any one. This picture shows the New Hampshire at anchor and several small boats similar to the one swamped as they are being towed to the landing with a crowd of sailors out "for a time on shore."

## CLUB WOMEN OF INDIANA FOR JOHNSON MEMORIAL

Nearly a Thousand Accredited Delegates Expected to Attend the Richmond Meeting.

Richmond, Ind., Oct. 25.—The streets of Richmond were crowded today with visiting club women from all parts of Indiana, and the arrival of each train added to the number already in the city. This great gathering of women, of whom nearly a thousand are expected as accredited delegates, is here for the fourth annual convention of the State Federation of Clubs, which had its preliminary opening today with a meeting of the executive committee and board of directors. The regular sessions will occupy tomorrow and Thursday. Prof. Graham Taylor of Chicago, Henry Turner Bailey of Boston and several other persons of note will address the convention.

Some important new witnesses have been summoned and it is believed the mystery of the girl's death may soon be solved.

### DELICIOUS GINGERBREAD.

Whereas, on the 10th day of August, 1910, the county commissioners' court made and entered of record in Vol. 16, page 510, of the commissioners' court minutes, an order for an election to be held to determine whether or not a majority of the qualified property tax-paying voters of said county desire that there shall be annually levied upon the property within said county by said commissioners' court, a tax of 15c on the One Hundred Dollars' worth of property for road purposes under the provisions of an amendment to the state constitution adopted in 1890.

Now, therefore, I, O. C. Funderburk, County Judge of said county, in pursuance of said order and by authority vested in me by Article 4787 of the revised statutes of Texas, do hereby give notice that said election shall be held in the several voting precincts of the county on the 8th day of November, 1910—the day of the general election; that said election shall be held and returns made by the officers holding said general election; that only qualified voters who are also property tax-payers of this county shall be permitted to vote at said election; that said election officers shall procure a separate ballot box for said election and shall be furnished separate poll and tally lists and separate returns and envelopes for said election, and shall hold and conduct said election according to the general laws governing the holding of elections. The ballots for said election shall have written or printed on them the words "For the Tax and Against the Tax," and those who favor the tax shall vote the ticket "For the Tax," and those who oppose the tax shall vote the ticket "Against the tax."

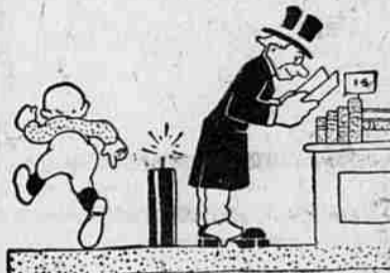
